That's because the lodge, comprising two totally separate and intimate camps each of 15 tented guest suites, is situated right where all the romantic 'Ngong Hills' scenes were filmed for the movie Out of Africa. At Angama Mara, you can almost hear Karen Blixen's words: *"Here I am, where I ought to be".* It is surely a place to fall in love with the world again.

It almost goes without saying that the game viewing in the Mara Triangle is among the most outstanding in Africa. Indeed, all our guests have to do is descend a private track directly from the lodge and 20 minutes later witness one of the continent's most dramatic events: a Mara River crossing. It's that easy.

Architects Silvio Rech and Lesley Carstens - of Ngorongoro Crater Lodge, North Island and Mombo fame - have designed Angama Mara to be a lodge quite unlike any other. Each tented suite literally hangs onto the edge of the escarpment, with views that go on and on. And Annemarie Meintjes, peerless African stylista, has tackled the lodge's interiors with a totally fresh, disarming, uncluttered and often humourous approach. This dynamic creative combination has been driven by the following two guiding principles: we have built Angama Mara to last; and Kenya is the home of safaris, so let's go back and start again. Our inspiration is drawn from the classic safari: romance, canvas, just the right amount of

everything, an elegant simplicity, and the desire to always be authentic.
